"People stand by the singers who send out a message."

[Sekou sings about his late mother to his sister and makes her cry while doing it. This is jeli work].

[Soriyo is a Manding term that indicates that the jelis will "call in the horses" when they sing- meaning they will bring big power through their music/message to their listeners.]
